We therefore support the claim that East and Southeast Europe cannot be understood in isolation; they can only be understood in the context of their interrelations with other world regions.</p> <p>Our research focuses on the period commencing in approximately 1800, a period of dramatic and continuing change in Eastern and Southeastern Europe. This was a period which distinguishes the region in a European context and has generated not only a rich field of study but also a great need for research.
