



International Study and Training Partnerships (ISAP)

Financial backer:	German Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF)
Enrolees:	German universities and UASs
Goal:	Increasing internationality by enhancing mobility
Partner Countries:	All countries outside the ERASMUS area except Brasil, for which a separate programme has been established (UNIBRAL)
Duration of	One academic year, extensions possible
Funding:	
Selection:	Committee of German professors <u>Criteria:</u> professional qualification and reputation of the partner university, qualification of the student applicants, reciprocity of the exchange, structural effects concerning internationalisation (transfer of credits, joint curricula development, double diploma/degree), strategic impact on the German university's international strategy
Financing:	By an endowment contract for the German university
Programme:	Group programme for highly qualified German and foreign students who complete a fully accredited study period of one or two terms within a partnership related to the specific field
Prerequisites:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Groups of at least 3 students• Enrolment at both universities• Students: sufficient command of the target language of instruction• Undergraduates: at least 2 semesters of studies at the home university, graduate students• Academic qualification above-average (upper 25%)• Full recognition of credits gained at the partner university by home university
Funding:	<p><u>For German students:</u> monthly scholarship and travel subsidy, amount depending on the partner country, monthly allowance for overseas insurances, tuition fees (up to 50% of regular fees)</p> <p><u>For foreign students:</u> funds for language courses and tutorials at the German university, monthly allowance for costs of accomodation and board (only for students from developing countries!)</p> <p><u>For professors and lecturers:</u> allowances for guest lectureships at the partner institution</p> <p><u>For project initiation and co-ordination:</u> travel subsidies for German professor planning or running an ISAP exchange</p>
