North Rhine-Westphalia is the largest and, economically, the strongest state of Germany's 16 states. More than 18 million people live between the Rhine and Weser rivers, or roughly as many people as in Australia or the state of New York.

Prime Minister Dr. Jürgen Rüttgers decided during his visit in June 2008 to continue a bursary program for students from the Palestinian territories which started in 2007. The program offers short-term bursaries for students from the selected Palestinian universities

- Al Quds University in East-Jerusalem;
- Bethlehem University;
- National University of Nablus

wishing to undertake studies and research in North Rhine-Westphalia.
