

In-Region Scholarships for Postgraduate Studies for Students from Yemen in Jordan • DAAD

Overview

Objective

The programme aims at fostering strong, internationally oriented higher education systems in Jordan with the capacity to contribute to sustainable development. To this end, scholarships are granted for development-related Master studies for individuals who plan to pursue a career in teaching and/or research at a higher education institution in Yemen.

By training future academic and professional leaders, the programme contributes to the following long-term impacts:

- Qualified professionals' involvement in the solution of development-related problems in Yemen
- Graduates strengthening education and research in Yemen
- Structural strengthening and regional networking of partner institutions and partner universities

To achieve these long-term impacts, the following outcomes have been formulated as programme objectives:

Programme objective 1: Graduates have qualified to take over responsible positions in their, or for their, region of origin.

Programme objective 2: The participation of women and underprivileged groups is reinforced.

Programme objective 3: Organizational, financial and personal capacities of partner institutions are strengthened.

As part of the "In-Country/In-Region Scholarship Programme", DAAD offers scholarships for Master studies. The programme is funded by the German Federal Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and aims at university staff in the first line, without neglecting the public sector demand of academically trained personnel.

Who can apply?

The target group are graduates from Yemen with a first academic degree who want to pursue Master's courses (Thesis Track) in Jordan.

What can be funded?

The In-Region Scholarship Programme supports full-time studies in subject areas with strong relevance to national development.

The scholarships at the two selected Jordanian universities are available in the following fields of graduate programmes:

- Mechanical Engineering*
- Computer Engineering*
- Network Engineering and Security*
- Electrical Engineering*
- Medical Laboratory Sciences**
- Computer Science**
- Mathematics**
- Data Sciences**

- Physical Therapy**

DAAD In-Region scholarship holders are also

a) encouraged to apply for a short-term research stay in Germany for 2 up to 6 months.

Please note:

- The short-term research stay in Germany should preferably be announced in the application for the regular scholarship and can only be awarded if the necessary financial means are available.
- If you would like to apply, please note that the funding period for a short-term research stay in Germany is part of the In-Region programme and the regular study period of the programme may not be exceeded by the short-term research stay in Germany, this must be included in the regular study period of the In-Region programme.

The short-term research scholarship includes:

- monthly scholarship payment for living costs
- health/accident/personal liability insurance
- flat-rate travel allowance

b) invited to apply for different Summer Schools in Germany (four weeks).

All further details regarding additional benefits and the additional application processes will be provided after admission to the scholarship programme.

Application requirements

What requirements must be met?

Applicants

- have successfully completed generally an at least three-year university degree (i.e. Bachelor degree or equivalent) with excellent results (at least: Second Class/Upper Division or equivalent, if applicable),
- clearly show motivation and strong commitment have thorough knowledge of the language of instruction (English and/or Arabic),
- have generally completed their last university degree not more than six years ago at the time of application,
- must be nationals or permanent residents of Yemen since at least five years,
- should generally be
 - a) staff member of a public university,
 - b) candidate considered for teaching or research staff recruitment and/or
 - c) from the public sector.

Please note that the Jordan universities only accept the degrees from certain universities. Some Jordan universities might have additional requirements for admission.

Female applicants, refugees with recognised refugee status and candidates from other less privileged regions or groups are especially encouraged to participate in the programme.

Scholarships are initially granted for one year and can be extended to a maximum of the regular period of study upon receipt of an application for extension. Scholars must demonstrate satisfactory progress before an extension is granted.

Language skills

- Please refer to the point "What can be funded?" in the tab "Overview" and check the DAAD's language requirements according to your desired study programme (marked with one or two asterisks):
 - * IELTS at least 6.5 and TOEFL (IBT) at least 90 (TOEFL home edition or IELTS indicator (online test) are also accepted)

** IELTS at least 5.5 and TOEFL (IBT) at least 69 (TOEFL home edition or IELTS indicator (online test) are also accepted)

The test should have been taken no longer than two years before the application deadline.

- Candidates who wish to apply at a Jordanian university should be aware that they might have to take an English language test a second time in Jordan because Jordanian universities do not accept all foreign language tests. The Jordanian universities only accept tests of TOEFL Ibt at Amideast and IELTS at British Council which usually must be taken in Jordan. Please check the homepage of the university of your choice to find out the specific language requirements.

Application Procedure

Application deadline

Application deadlines are updated at least once a year. In most cases, they are in the same period as the previous year. You can find the current dates here:

Application documents

Mandatory documents to be submitted in English for the DAAD scholarship application via the DAAD online portal:

- DAAD application form (available in the DAAD-Portal)
- Identification document (i.e. passport or ID card); if your nationality is not Yemeni, please submit a proof of residency in Yemen for the last five years (to be submitted via "Miscellaneous")
- Curriculum vitae in tabular form (max. 3 pages)
- Letter of motivation (1 to 3 pages)

- Letter of admission for the host university (this can be subsequently submitted before the scholarship begins, if it is not available at the time of application)
- Certified copies of university degree certificates including transcripts (the final certificate must be submitted as soon as possible and before the start of the scholarship at the latest, if it is not available at the time of application; transcripts must be submitted until the application deadline)
- School-leaving certificate which entitled holders to study at a university in their home country, including all individual grades)
- Semester schedule (if applicable, please add the information how and when a planned research stay in Germany would fit into the semester schedule)
- Proof of English language abilities; please refer to the point "What can be funded?" in the tab "Overview" and check the language requirements according to your desired study programme (marked with one or two asterisks):
 - * IELTS at least 6.5 and TOEFL (IBT) at least 90 (TOEFL home edition or IELTS indicator (online test) are also accepted)
 - ** IELTS at least 5.5 and TOEFL (IBT) at least 69 (TOEFL home edition or IELTS indicator (online test) are also accepted). The test should have been taken no longer than two years before the time of application (see point "Language skills").

- One recommendation letter by a university teacher (to be submitted by post; see point "Application location")

Optional documents:

- Additional documents that might be relevant for your application (e.g. proof of internships, proof of employment)
- List of publications (max. 10 pages)

Important information regarding your application:

- Your application is only valid if you submit all the required documents to the DAAD portal on time. Incomplete or incorrect applications cannot be considered. You are responsible for ensuring that your applications are complete.

- Certificates, proof of credits, certifications and translations may be scanned in non-certified form and uploaded to the DAAD portal. The DAAD reserves the right to request certified copies of the documents.
- If you do not have documents such as recommendation letter and/or letter of admission at the time of application, please mention and explain this at an appropriate place in the application.
- Please note that the scholarship only becomes effective as soon as the admission letter from the university is issued. This must be submitted to the DAAD Portal as soon as possible and is part of a complete application (this can be subsequently submitted before the scholarship begins if it is not available before).

Application location

All application documents have to be submitted via the DAAD portal, except for the reference letter.
