In the first phase in Bamberg, teaching consists of a balanced mix of lectures and seminars. Instruction in two foreign business languages is provided in small seminar groups throughout the first four semesters. One of these languages can be business German for students with a foreign school leaving certificate.

The one to two-semester study abroad experience will be co-organised and supported by our International Office. The students will have the freedom to choose their courses before the start of their stay (changes are possible), thus guaranteeing credit transfer.

Upon graduation, the Faculty for Social Sciences, Economics, and Business Administration of the University of Bamberg will award a Bachelor of Science (BSc) degree in European Economic Studies (EES).

Academic admission requirements	General Higher Education Entrance Qualification (in Germany: "Allgemeine Hochschulreife/Abitur") or an equivalent after 12 to 13 years of schooling.
Language requirements	As the courses are partly taught in German, applicants whose native tongue is not German need to certify their command of the German language through the "Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang ausländischer Studienbewerber (DSH)" (German language test for the university admission of foreign students). Alternatively, they can certify their command of the German language through: • a DSH certificate of a "Studienkolleg" or another university

Accommodation	Bamberg's housing market has changed considerably in recent years. The demand for private accommodations is quite high, and rent prices continue to increase. The common trend seen in many cities, and particularly in university cities, is now quite apparent in Bamberg, too.
