Course Details

Course organisation

In just three semesters, this MBA programme prepares you for a leading position in both inhouse consulting and external consulting. The lectures in the first and second semesters are followed by the writing of the Master's thesis, ideally in connection with an internship. Our lecturers' expertise, individual supervision in small classes, and an international learning environment will support your personal growth.

Winter semester

The first semester of the academic year is called the winter semester in Germany and it begins in early October. The MBA programme kicks off with a two-day orientation that introduces students to life on campus and its surroundings and also includes gatherings with the university's academic and administrative staff members. In mid-October, IBC students attend an orientation week in Montafon, Austria, that includes team-building activities and a business simulation game. In the winter semester, students take a Christmas break for approx. two week and classes reconvene in the second week of January. In February, students have the first examination period of the year.

Summer semester

The summer semester begins around mid-March and continues until the beginning of July. There is a mid-semester break for one week, and the examination period takes place in July.

Winter semester (Master's thesis)

In the final semester, IBC students embark on their Master's thesis. The submission deadline for the thesis is the end of the winter semester.

The Master's thesis can be accomplished in three ways:

1. The student obtains a temporary internship in an organisation or business to work on a topic proposed by that organisation or business.

	 The student is offered an internship in an organisation or business and then decides on the thesis topic in the course of his or her internship. This could be in collaboration with the organisation, or it could be a topic carried out independently of the student's position and work at the organisation. The student may have a topic in mind, or a topic may be proposed to him or her by an academic member. The thesis can then be pursued full time, independently of an external organisation. The evaluation of the thesis will be followed by a defence of the thesis. One of the two supervisors has to be an internal faculty member and another should be an external supervisor. Alternatively, both supervisors can be internal lecturers.

	 Bachelor's degree in any field Minimum of two years of professional experience (internships do not count)
	Please apply to the programme using our online application system HISinOne.
	The selection committee will then screen your online application. Within a few days, you will be notified as to whether or not you have been selected to provide a complete application. The selection committee will then make a final decision based on the scanned documents, which you are asked to submit.
	Please be aware that you will have to show your original documents at the registrar's office of Offenburg University after your arrival.

Services

Possibility of finding parttime employment

- **On-campus**: A limited number of student assistant positions and tutoring jobs are available. Knowledge of English is usually sufficient for these positions.
- Off-campus: Students are allowed to hold off-campus jobs for a maximum of 20 hours per

	week during the lecture period and to work a maximum of 240 half days per year (according to regulations for foreign students requiring a visa). At least a basic knowledge of German is usually required for off-campus positions.
Accommodation	In the International Student Barometer, the largest survey of international students worldwide, Offenburg University was rated number one among German universities for its arrival assistance for international students. Before your arrival, the Graduate School team can arrange accommodation (student residence hall or private accommodation) for you. The rent is approximately 400 EUR per month.
Career advisory service	Offenburg University's Career Center offers you a personal advisory service, directing you through your contemplated or chosen career path. Seminars on "Applying in Germany" will get you ready for successfully writing applications and presenting yourself to companies. The Career Center will also help to correct and translate CVs and letters of motivation. In addition, Offenburg University hosts a career day at the university and participates regularly in recruitment fairs in Cologne, Hannover, or other bigger cities. At these fairs, students can directly contact companies, make enquiries about available positions, and discuss any concerns that they may have.

Offenburg University of Applied Sciences

Offenburg University is a research-rich, business-focused, high-performance institution in the Black Forest, a German economic powerhouse. We are among the top five in applied research in the south-west and an active member of the European University Association. Offenburg is a highly-ranked university according to the CHE ranking, forming a thriving community with 4,000 students

on two campuses.

The university is widely recognised for its international reach, and it was one of the first German universities with international Master's programmes.

International students account for 12% of the student body. They benefit from the advantages of a smaller institution with an excellent student-teacher ratio and personal attention from instructors. State-of-the-art media, electronic, and mechanical laboratories and facilities help students put their ideas into practice. WiFi access is provided throughout the campus.

The university is known for its emphasis on practical skills and applied research. Its close ties to the regional business community include many world-renowned companies. It is also strongly committed to providing an internationally oriented education. In particular, the English-taught Master's programmes of the Graduate School have won a number of awards, including the DAAD's quality label "TOP 10 International Master's Degree Courses Made in Germany".

The Graduate School's staff offers ongoing support throughout the programme:

- extensive assistance in finding accommodation
- "senior buddy" system (personal mentor for the first few weeks)
- assistance with immigration services and authorities
- guided tours of Offenburg and Gengenbach
- individual support and advice from the coordinators of each programme

- German language course in September

University location

Offenburg University has campuses in Offenburg and the nearby town of Gengenbach, which hosts the department of Business and Industrial Engineering with the MBA programme International Business Consulting.

Both cities are situated in the pretty Ortenau region, which is considered to be the "gateway to the Black Forest". Nonetheless, the cities are only short distances away from major cities, including Karlsruhe, Freiburg, Baden-Baden, Strasbourg/France, and Basel/Switzerland. Additionally, this south-western part of Germany offers a comfortable climate with warm and pleasant summers and winter temperatures rarely dropping below zero.

Offenburg's city centre offers a variety of department stores and speciality shops as well as a farmers' market on Tuesday and Saturday mornings. Inexpensive groceries can be found at the major supermarket chains around town.

Located about 10 kilometres east of Offenburg, Gengenbach is easily accessible by way of local trains. It is a picturesque town with approximately 12,000 inhabitants, charming half-timbered houses, quaint shops, typical Baden gastronomy, and markets and festivals which attract tourists from all over the world. The university campus is located in a well-preserved Benedictine monastery in the middle of town, and it boasts a captivating Baroque interior.

Although Offenburg and Gengenbach are relatively small, they each offer great cultural and recreational possibilities. There are various festivals and festivities throughout the year, including the famous German carnival season, wine festivals in the autumn, and one of Germany's most popular Christmas markets, where Gengenbach City Hall represents a huge Advent calendar.

This is a very peaceful and family-friendly area with an almost non-existent crime rate. While it is always wise to be alert and to use the 'buddy system' when going home after dark, the region generally offers a safe environment, even if you are alone.

Nearby cities include Strasbourg (France), 25 km, capital of the European Union and seat of the European Parliament; Freiburg, 65 km; Karlsruhe, 75 km; Heidelberg, 110 km; Basel (Switzerland), 120 km; Stuttgart, 140 km; and Frankfurt, 200 km.

Offenburg is close (35/50/130 km) to the international airports of Strasbourg, Karlsruhe, and Basel-Mulhouse, which are mainly served by low-cost carriers (easyJet, Ryanair, among others). The main German airport hub in Frankfurt can be reached by high-speed train in around
