Description/content	Liberal Arts and Sciences (LAS) is a specific approach to Bachelor's-level education – a process of intellectual discovery and personal development in an interdisciplinary and international learning community. The Freiburg LAS programme reaches across academic fields and offers discipline-oriented academic training in a particular major. It encourages students to critically reflect on science and knowledge and become skilled communicators and creative shapers of their environments.

- The language of instruction is English. Students who do not speak German must learn German up to A2 (CEFR) during their LAS studies.
- LAS is a selective programme with an annual intake of 80 students.
- The LAS programme has three parts: core (56 ECTS credits), major (120 ECTS credits), and electives (64 ECTS credits).

Contents

- 1. The core is shared by all LAS students. It includes academic skills and reflections on knowledge and science as well as a curriculum on responsibility and leadership.
- **2.** The majors provide an in-depth education in a specific academic field that is, in itself, interdisciplinary. After their first year of studies, students choose one of the following majors:
 - Culture and History
 - Environmental and Sustainability Sciences
 - Governance
 - Life Sciences
- **3.** In theelectives, LAS students shape their own study profiles. They can take courses at other university departments and across our European networks (EUCOR and EPICUR), take language classes, study abroad for a semester or two, and/or undertake internships or independent projects.

LAS graduates are prepared for careers in international environments that come with complex responsibilities and require fast and efficient adaptation to varying challenges. About 85% of LAS graduates continue with Master's and PhD programmes. For more information on what graduates of the LAS programme at UCF are doing, see the UCF website.

Course Details

Course organisation

During the first year of LAS, the so-called **foundational year**, students largely follow the same curriculum and establish a shared basis of knowledge and skills. From year two onwards, students can design their own study programme, meaning individual study trajectories will progress quite differently:

- After your first year of studies and having completed three introductions to different majors, you choose your major.
- Beyond classes in the major, you will take further core courses, notably on leadership and responsibility.
- You will have substantial freedom to take courses of your choice in the programme's electives section.
- Furthermore, we encourage you to spend part of yourstudies abroad. About 80% of all LAS
 students seize the opportunity to gain experience abroad, usually during their third year of
 study.
- In the last semester of year four, students write the Bachelor's thesis in the area of their major.

Integrated study abroad unit(s)

Internationality is an important aspect of the Liberal Arts and Sciences programme. This shows with regard to students and staff and in the course content. LAS students are encouraged to spend at least one semester abroad and about 80% do so, usually during their third year of studies. The University of Freiburg has a broad range of exchange programmes with partners all over the world that are open to LAS students. Furthermore, UCF has structured exchanges with several partners, e.g.:

- University College Maastricht (including adouble degree programme)
- Yale-NUS College in Singapore
- School of International Liberal Studies at Waseda University
- Erasmus partnerships with university colleges and universities in England, France, the Netherlands, Spain, and Sweden

UCF provides support in organising a semester or a year abroad, especially concerning the integration into your LAS curriculum and credit recognition. In addition to studying abroad, LAS students can study at any of the European Campus universities in the Upper Rhine region during their time in Freiburg. Finally, UCF and Freiburg are part of EPICUR, a pilot "European University" with partners across Europe.

Integrated internships

The electives section of the programme allows for credit recognition of academically relevant internships, subject to approval by the LAS Board of Studies.

Costs of living

Participants must ensure that sufficient funding is available to finance their participation in a course of study. The average cost of living in Freiburg for one month is currently approx. 850 EUR to 1,000 EUR.

Some details:

- Rooms in private accommodation including extra costs: 350 EUR 700 EUR
- Rooms in student residences: 250 EUR and 550 EUR including extra costs
- Private expenses amount to around 350 EUR per month.
- Health insurance (recommended) is available for approx. 120 EUR per month.
- Transport: A special student ticket for regional transport costs approx. 89 EUR per semester.

Requirements / Registration

Academic admission requirements

The LAS programme has an annual intake of 80 students. The programme is selective. Selection is based on your academic achievements, your motivation for studying with us in Freiburg, and the match between the LAS programme and prospective students. Our target group is students with intellectual curiosity and responsibility who are looking for breadth and depth in their academic training. The application requirements are:

- University entrance qualification: school leaving diploma and transcript of grades
- Proof of English proficiency at min. B2 (CEFR)
- Application essay (500 words maximum)
- Letter of motivation (500 words maximum)
- Study-orientation test, e.g. the LAS Online Study Choice Assistant (OSA)

Applicants must provide proof of English proficiency at level B2 or above according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

The University of Freiburg was founded in 1457 as a classical comprehensive university, making it one of the oldest institutions of higher education in Germany. Awarded for its excellence in both research and teaching, the university also boasts a long history, with numerous Nobel laureates. Brilliant scholars and creative thinking distinguish it today as a modern, top-notch university, well equipped for the challenges of the 21st century. As an organisation with around 24,500 students, 288 degree programmes, and 6,536 employees (2021), the University of Freiburg is committed to family friendliness, equal opportunities, and environmental consciousness in its day-to-day operations. The structure of the university is multifaceted, ranging from 11 academic faculties – from the humanities and the social and

natural sciences all the way to engineering – to 19 research centres. This goes to show that we are a dynamic, large-scale institution with a diverse educational offering. As studies, research, and continuing education are all an integral part of this offering, we maintain a close relationship with the city and the region as well as with the international academic community. Bilateral partnerships, research projects, joint study courses and memberships in international networks such as the League of European Research Universities (LERU) and of EUCOR – The European Campus are examples of the university's strong transnational relations. All our students, including those from abroad, can take courses at the Universities of Basel (Switzerland) and Strasbourg (France) without having to enrol. Via EUCOR, The European Campus mobility grant, they also receive allowances for travel expenses to their partner institutions.

University location

Freiburg im Breisgau is a city in south-western Germany on the edge of the Black Forest. Freiburg was founded by Konrad and Duke Bertold III of Zähringen in 1120 as a free market town – hence its name, which translates to "free town". Freiburg holds a central position in Europe at the trijunction of Switzerland, France, and Germany, and is the city with the most hours of sunshine per year in Germany. It is nestled in one of the oldest cultural landscapes north of the Alps, a location which has had an unmistakable influence on the town. The university plays an essential part in the quality of life in Freiburg; both in the academic sphere and in the perception of the general public, the activities of the university are of central importance. Since its founding, teaching, learning and research have formed an indivisible whole.

With approx. 230,000 inhabitants, Freiburg has a friendly size, offering the safe surroundings of a smaller city whilst at the same time excelling in terms of culture, shopping and infrastructure. Both the inhabitants and the city government of Freiburg attach great importance to ecological values and sustainable development. This "green city" atmosphere influences many aspects of city life – from the numerous cyclists on the streets to cutting-edge solar energy research. Surrounded by the beautiful landscapes of the Black Forest and the wine-growing regions of the Rhine Valley, Freiburg is a popular destination for tourism and leisure activities.
