<b>Fachliches Profil:</b>	Politikwissenschaft mit Schwerpunkt auf Fragen der politischen, gesellschaftlichen und kulturellen Entwicklung Deutschlands und Europas
<b>Lehraufgaben:</b>	Vier Kurse pro Jahr (zwei pro Semester): bis zu drei im Undergraduate Bereich, mindestens einer im Masterbereich. Die inhaltliche Gestaltung richtet sich zum Teil nach den curricularen Erfordernissen der Universität, ansonsten nach den wissenschaftlichen Schwerpunkten des/der Kandidaten/in  Aktive Mitarbeit bei Planung und Organisation kulturpolitischer Aktivitäten der Gasthochschule zur Vermittlung eines zeitgemäßen Deutschlandbildes
<b>Voraussetzungen:</b>	Abgeschlossene Promotion; einschlägige wissenschaftliche Veröffentlichungen; mehrjährige Lehrerfahrung; sehr gute Englischkenntnisse; Staatsangehörigkeit eines EU-Mitgliedsstaats
<b>Beginn:</b>	September 2019
<b>Dauer:</b>	Besetzung zunächst für die Dauer von zwei Jahren, mit Verlängerungsmöglichkeit

Die Beschreibung der jeweiligen Position formuliert die Gasthochschule im *DAAD Professorship Questionnaire* wie folgt:

**INFORMATION DESCRIBING THE POSITION AND FUNCTIONS OF THE DAAD PROFESSOR**

a) Length of initial appointment, renewability:

**The length of the initial appointment will be two years, renewable for a further three years.**

b) Status of the appointee (assistant guest professor, associate guest professor, guest professor):

**Visiting Assistant Professor (this is the title UNC uses for all guest professors)**

c) Disciplinary field and areas of specialization and sub-specialization preferred:

**Political Science with a specialization in European Studies. The DAAD Visiting Assistant Professor will teach one course in the TAM Program each fall semester and three further courses in the Political Science Department that would be cross-listed with the EURO undergraduate major. We also plan for the DAAD Professor to develop new courses related to Germany and Europe to expand offerings in the EURO major and the TAM Program. The DAAD Professor should therefore have specialization in contemporary European politics, society, or culture.**

d) Desired qualifications of the DAAD Professor:

**The DAAD Professor should hold a PhD in Political Science or equivalent, have a good command of English, and be interested in interdisciplinary research. Prior teaching experience at the undergraduate level is also essential. UNC-CH will have a selection committee for DAAD's short list consisting of faculty from CES' Advisory Board, including the Center's Director and Executive Director, and the Chair of the Political Science Department.**

e) What is the regular course load the DAAD Professor will be expected to carry per academic year?

**The regular course load of faculty at UNC-CH is four courses per year, which will be the same for the DAAD Professor (one MA-level TAM course, plus three further courses at the BA and MA levels).**

f) To what extent will research focus and academic specialization of the DAAD Professor be given weight in designing course topics? To what extent will the DAAD Professor be expected to teach within an established curriculum? What are likely course topics to be assigned to the DAAD Professor?

**The DAAD Professor will have the opportunity to develop additional courses within the requirements listed above that fit with their own research interests.**

g) Will courses taught by the DAAD Professor be eligible for cross-listing with other units of the host institution?

**Yes, courses will be cross-listed in Political Science and the EURO undergraduate major. Further cross-listings are possible depending on the course material with departments such as: German Studies, History, Global Studies, and Anthropology, for example.**

h) Ratio and level of graduate and undergraduate courses the DAAD Professor will be expected to teach:

**Usually, the Professor will teach 2 graduate level courses and 2 undergraduate level courses, but a TAM MA course will be required each fall.**

i) Estimated number of students expected to enroll in the courses taught by the DAAD Professor:

**The number of students in each course will range between 20 and 45 students.**

j) Additional duties and activities expected of the DAAD Professor within and outside the university (e.g. local and regional outreach activities, fostering of a more productive relationship with German institutions and the German scholarly community):

**The DAAD Professor would be expected to be an active participant in activities of the Center for European Studies and the Political Science Department. This would include participating in interdisciplinary research working groups such as the NC German Studies Seminar and off-campus outreach programs with teachers and community members. He or she would also have support to organize their own lecture series or workshop.**
