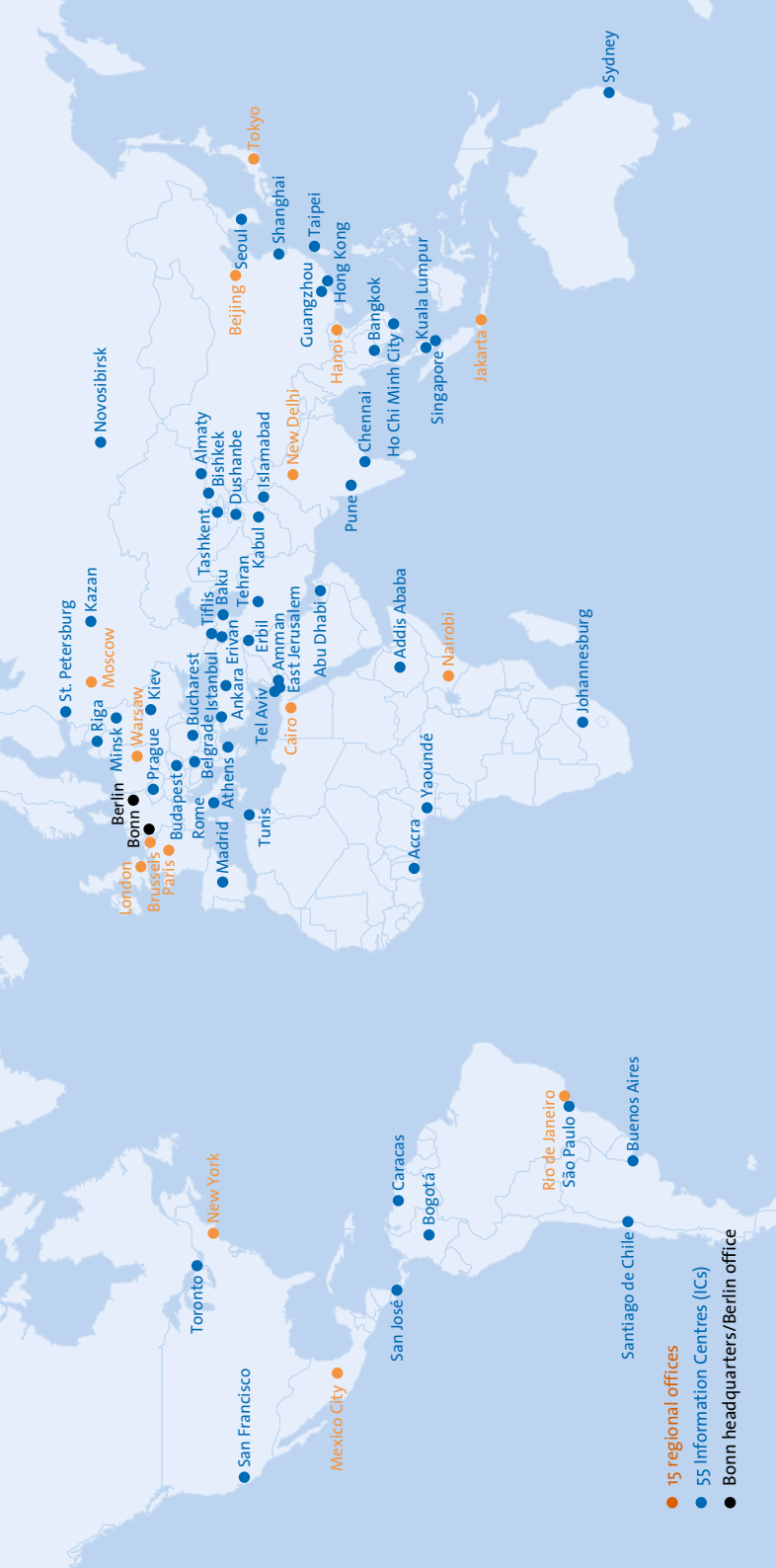

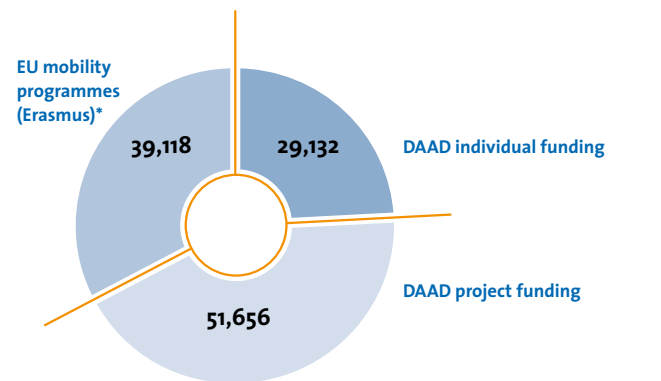

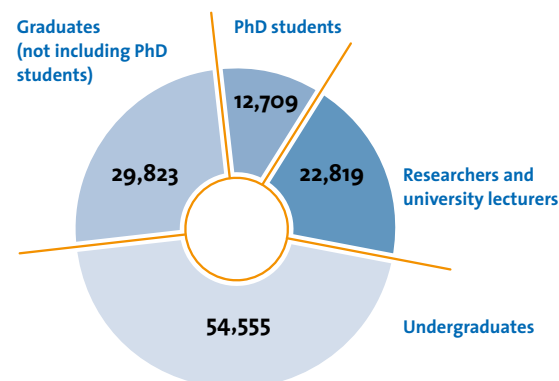
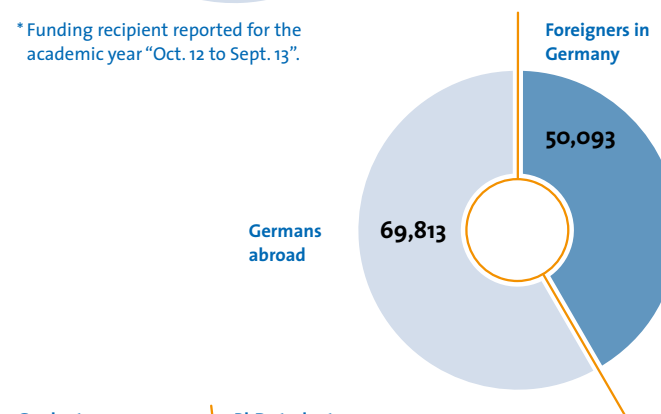

Northern, Southern and Western Europe



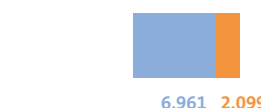

Programmes and activities of the DAAD

The DAAD

The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) is a joint organisation of German institutions of higher education and their student bodies, devoted to internationalising the academic and scientific research system. With the scholarship programmes, the DAAD enables students, researchers and university lecturers to take advantage of the best study and research opportunities available.

It promotes transnational cooperation and university partnerships, and is the German national agency for EU higher education cooperation. The DAAD actively supports Germany's foreign cultural and educational policy goals, national scientific policies and development cooperation efforts. In addition to overseeing the International DAAD Academy (iDA), the DAAD operates a network of 70 Regional Offices and Information Centres worldwide.

The DAAD awards scholarships to

- German and foreign students, doctoral candidates and researchers in all disciplines
- Graduates of German Schools abroad
- Professionals and business leaders from developing countries
- German and foreign student interns
- International artists in the Berlin Artist-in-Residence programme

The DAAD supports structures for internationalisation through

- University partnerships and project-based research collaboration with foreign universities
- Promotion of internationalisation strategies at German universities
- Transnational education projects organised by German universities
- Research institutes and centres of excellence in emerging and developing countries
- Projects which strengthen the international dimension in subject-related research programmes
- Marketing measures promoting higher education and research in Germany
- Information on study and research opportunities abroad
- Degree programmes with an integrated foreign-study phase and double degrees
- EU mobility programmes
- Support of German Lektors and promotion of German language instruction at foreign universities
- Germany-related degree programmes and Centres of German and European Studies abroad
- Promotion of transformation and democratisation processes
- Higher-education cooperative projects in the field of development cooperation
- Intercultural dialogue to surmount lines of conflict

The DAAD provides expertise

- for internationalising the German higher education sector
- on academic and scientific research systems and the international education market
- with continuing education measures for university personnel

Budget

The operating budget of the DAAD is largely financed by the German Federal Foreign Office (AA), the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF), the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) and the European Union (EU).

The 16 states of the Federal Republic of Germany are responsible for covering the tuition expenses for foreign scholarship recipients. Other funding providers include foreign governments, businesses, foundations and the Stifterverband für die Deutsche Wissenschaft.
